Dinner-Dance Re-acquaints Class of 1960

Ninety-five persons--members of the Class of 1960, their spouses and guests--attended the ten year reunion Saturday, June 27, 1970, at the Astorhurst Restaurant.

A social hour began at 7:30 p. m. with a special bar set up outside the banquet room to accommodate the group.

Each person in attendance received a name tag appropriately designated in crimson and gold. Made of construction paper and yarn pom-poms or rosettes, the tags had been assembled prior to this evening by members of the reunion committee.

Special features

which received much attention were two bulletin boards, displaying pictures, programs, newspaper clippings, "victory" buttons, a graduation tassel, and other souvenirs accumulated from memorable events throughout high school.

As people arrived, they readily became engrossed with meeting and greeting one another, engaging in conversation as though the interim ten years had simple melted away.

It was 8:45 p.m. before everyone's attention could be directed toward dinner. At each place was a napkin upon which was printed "Brecksville High 10th Reunion, June 27, 1970"

and a mint cup decorated with a smiling red bee. On the bottom of each cup was a number which was later used to determine door prize winners.

Reunion chairman, Bill Faulhaber welcomed everyone and introduced the members of the committee. Benediction was given by Jim Granowicz, followed by a family style dinner. The menu consisted of tomato juice, relishes, tossed salad, rolls, breaded pork chops, roast beef, fried chicken, mashed potatoes, green beans, corn fritters, assorted cream pies, and beverages. Much bantering and frivolity ensued, particularly between Terry

Kopf and John Carucci, who were seated at opposite ends of the table.

While the tables were being cleared and dessert served, Claudia Stadler Schwark drew the numbers for door prizes. A total of 34 gifts were given away, ranging from bakery certificates to a string of cultured pearls. Area merchants had donated these gifts valued at approximately one hundred fifty dollars.

The band arrived toward the end of dinner and were ready to play as everyone drifted back into conversational groupings. Father Krasen, unable to attend dinner because of parish responsibilities, arrived shortly after the music started. The selections, reminiscent of the hits of the past decade, varied in tempo from ballads to the latest beat. Rosemary Conners interrupted the festivities to read George Exoo's telegram which was addressed to his assembled classmates.

Few people left before the banquet room was closed at 1:00 a.m. But for about forty persons activities extended far into the night as they reassembled at the home of Mr. Don Faulhaber. Bill had invited everyone to this early morning weiner roast and swim party. Only about six brave souls accepted the invitation to swim in the heated pool as the night air was rather sharp. A final adieu was said at 4:30 a.m.

Anxious anticipation had long passed, and only a pleasant memory lingered on.

Three Mentors Attend Banquet

Mr. Walter Wisniewski, Mr. Joseph Lewandowski, and Mr. Joseph Vadini were the only three Brecksville faculty members who accepted the invitation to attend the reunion. Letters had been sent to those teachers who had been instrumental

in the educating of the class, whether or not they were still on the Brecksville staff.

Mr. Lewandowski, sporting the start of a full beard, is taking life a little easier since suffering a heart attack last year. He now serves as head of

the math department at Brecksville.

Walking with the aid of a cane because of an injury incurred playing softball, Mr. Vadini enjoyed reliving glorious moments with some of his former gridiron greats. While he is still the Bees' head football coach, he is now a full-time guidance counselor.

With a copy of the 1960 BEEHIVE anchored firmly under his arm, Mr. Wisniewski, high school principal, found the evening all too short to visit with everyone in attendance.

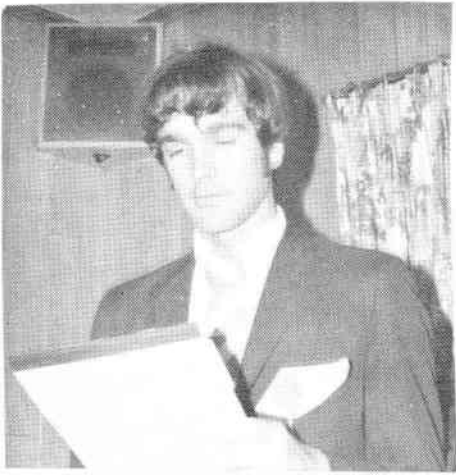
